The Bloomingdale Garden Club celebrated its 60th Anniversary with a gala "Gratitude" luncheon on Sunday, October 29th at the Bloomingdale Golf Course. Over 80 guests included members and their families, as well as VIPs and longtime friends.

President Cheryl Svee welcomed everyone and mentioned that our gratitude extended to the refined relationship the Club enjoys with the Bloomingdale Park District and she introduced Joe Potts, Executive Director, who spoke enthusiastically about the history of this relationship over the span of 12 years and told about the success of the community gardens.

Bloomingdale Mayor, Franco Coladipietro, read the Proclamation issued by the Village and congratulated the Club on achieving 60 years of service to the community.

Among the VIP guests was Diane Greenawalt from Garden Clubs of Illinois who spoke of the Club's many achievements.

Joyce Basel acknowledged the pride the Club has in having many of the octagenarian members present and a standing ovation was given to the Club's most senior member, Josephine Dabrowski at 90+. Gratitude of the entire club and

everyone present was also extended to two members who are Veterans—Kirt Shore, Boatswaine's Mate First Class who served in the Navy Reserve for six years, and Hector Rivera, Sergeant in the US Air Force who served for six years and was in the last bombing raids in Vietnam.

The annual plant sale hosted by the club provides the funds for the club's generous philanthropic program and Linda Kunesh spoke of the history of this plant sale which originated in the front yard of members some 50 years ago to the highly successful event now held in the Park District maintenance building.

Gail Sanders told guests of the participation by almost all members of the club in planting, watering and weeding the Community Garden which has over the years provided several thousand pounds of fresh produce to local food pantries for those in need.

The grand finale of the day was the announcement of the winner of the Auction of an African Adventure. Dan and Kelly Vitacco won the auction and were joined by two more winners Cheryl Svee and Peggy Laraia! While it was not the intention that this event become a fund raiser, nevertheless, the hugely successful auction of over 20 beautiful baskets and the safari has given the club additional funds to enhance its philanthropy in the year to come.



The aspirations of the original small group of women who started the club 60 years ago have certainly been achieved by the men and women who are today's dedicated and hardworking members.


Office of the Mayor Village of Bloomingale PROCLAMATION Celebrating 60 Years of The Bloomingdale Garden Club October 2023



When I think of Bloomingdale Park District's Executive Director, Joe Potts, two words come to mind: "Of Course." Any time we have made a request to Joe, this has been his immediate response: "Can we have our Perennial Potting Party at the Maintenance Building?" (I'm not sure Joe even knew what a Perennial Potting Party was!) "Of course." "Joe, Costco is donating a shed for us to store equipment. Can we put it at the Park District Maintenance Building?" His response, "OF COURSE". . . then it became TWO sheds! Joe and the Park District have consistently supported our Plant Sales, not only with their cooperation, but also in PURCHASING our plants to beautify Bloomingdale parks!

Over the years, many deep friendships have been formed in the club at the Plant Sales. Testaments to this is how many members re-join each year, or come back to the Club who for whatever reason left for a while. Even our friend Joan who moved to KY, came back to help at our sales and is here today to celebrate with us.



Proceeds of our Sales fund our great monthly programs and are donated to various local charities and non-profits. Over the past 10 years, Bloomingdale Garden Club has donated \$70,665 to organizations that have included:

Bloomindale VFW Post 7539 Midwest Shelter for Homeless Vets DuPage PADS Garden Works Project Humanitarian Service Project We Grow Dreams Various Food Pantries Stepping Stones DuPage Care Center

Our involvement with DuPage Care Center began in 2012 when Bloomingdale Garden Club was the lead agency, along with University of IL Extension DuPage Master Gardeners that submitted a grant proposal to the Christopher and Dana Reeve Foundation to benefit the Garden Program at the Care Center.

Our Club's proposal was one of 76 winning proposals nation-wide out of more than 300 applications submitted! To our delight, we were awarded our FULL request of \$10,748 dollars!

They say success breeds success: This award was the catalyst for more organizations to support the Care Center's Garden Program where more than 50 Resident Gardeners have their own garden plot to grow vegetables, herbs, and flowers of their choice.

The Resident Gardeners may: Keep the produce and flowers for themselves; give them to family and staff; or provide "mini-farmers' markets where the produce and flowers are sold to staff and volunteers. The money raised is then used to fund an end-of-year celebration. Surplus food is then donated to area food pantries. 221 pounds were donated just this season!

Bloomingdale Garden Club has assisted with planting not only the Residents' plots but also some large in-ground beds—including a large pollinator garden planted with natives & perennials. Due to the efforts of our friend Leslie Mabbot, Midwest Groundcovers donated more than \$800 in plants for the Pollinator Garden. Our pollinator population has exploded!

I could go on and on and tell you more stories how our Plant Sales have had an impact on others. Suffice it to say, Bloomingdale Garden Club is a premier garden club. And it is due to all of you who support it with your time and talents!



So many club members engaged in the activity of creating centerpieces for our tables at this event. Our theme was gratitude and fall colors. The creativity was outstanding and created a warm and welcoming feeling. Each table had a winner (or more) when it was announced the second person to the left of the most recent birthday could take it home. Thank you so much to all that contributed!

Our 60th Anniversary Seeds of Gratitude gift Commemorating the 60th Anniversary of Bloomingdale Garden Club was donated to us by Ball Horticulture Company. It was our thank you gift to guests for "helping us grow."







The idea to start a garden that would supply fresh vegetables to a local food pantry came from garden club members.

A committee consisting of members from our club, Bloomingdale Park District staff, University of Illinois Extension DuPage Master Gardeners, and Roselle Park District Garden Club researched existing community gardens. They looked at their facilities and regulations and came up with an idea of what they would like. After visiting and evaluating various Bloomingdale Park District sites, they decided on an an area near the maintenance garage on Springfield Drive. A site map was drawn up for three demonstration gardens to be worked by members of the Bloomingdale Garden Club, the Roselle Park District Garden Club, and the U of I Extension Master Gardeners along with plots for community members to rent to grow their own produce.

Once the plans were in place, the park District went to work installing water lines, tilling the grassy site, and amending the ground with compost. During this time a fundraising garage sale was held by the club to purchase the needed supplies—tools, hoses, tomato cages, and other miscellaneous items. A shed to house these things was donated by Costco and installed by the Park District.



The first year, 2015, only the three 20 ft x 20 ft demonstration gardens were ready, and our club jumped right in. In subsequent years, plots of 100 sq ft, 140 sq ft, and 200 sq ft were readied for renters followed by raised beds to accommodate gardeners of all abilities. A kiosk where gardening information could be displayed, and a weighing/donation station were added. Club members voted to call our garden the Plot-to-Plate Garden and there is a lovely permanent sign to mark it.

We have been working our plot ever since that start in 2015 and have added compost, coffee grounds, pumpkins, leaves, and other amendments to increase the fertility of the soil. This year we received a generous donation of 10 heavy duty tomato cages from Better Bilt Products in Addison to help us corral those huge plants resulting from these soil improvements.

I have been actively involved since 2016, and during the past 8 years, the club has donated over 3500 pounds of produce to food panties. This is not something I have done by myself. Members of this year's Plot-to-Plate committee include Eileen Spaman, Susan Glick-Shore, and Barbara Weisenburger. And in previous years, Cheryl Svee, the late Joyce Boryla, and the late Kathy Mikutis were also members.

The garden is not something that the four of us tend alone. We have been aided by many members of the club who have volunteered to spend a week or two during the growing season to come and water or weed the plot. The economy and world conditions make your work even more important as we get fresh, organic produce to people who need it.

Finally, our club's commitment to the community gardens continues as Joyce Basel, Linda Kunesh, and I along with two Master Gardeners and Park District staff meet 6 times a year to oversee the operation of the gardens. None of this would have been possible without the wonderful cooperation of the Bloomingdale Park District. A big "Thank You" to them!
